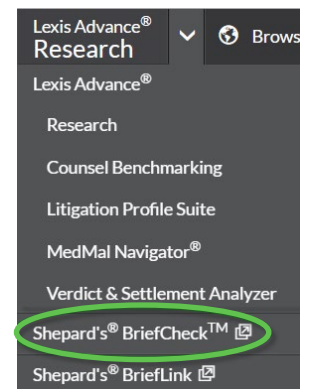

- Validate citations through *Shepard's*[®] Citations Service. The BriefCheck service generates a concise citation summary report tagging problem areas for your attention.
- Verify quotations and deliver a QuoteCheck[™] report validating quote accuracy.
- Retrieve the full text of documents cited. Check each of your case-law citations (case name, parallel citations, jurisdictions, court and date) against the same information in *Shepard's* Citations Service.



Want your results sorted a specific way—perhaps by relevance for cases, by date for news or by jurisdiction for secondary materials—every time? Now you can choose sort criteria for each content type. Choose once and that sort order stays, search to search and session to session.


Go to the **Sort by:** pull-down menu next to your results and select **Edit Default Order**. (Or start at the **More** pull-down menu on the black experience bar, select **Settings** and go to **Default 'Sort by' Settings**.) Either way, it's one and done. Select the pull-down menu for any available content type and save your changes.



Navigate search terms seamlessly from one document to the next. Select a search term or phrase from the **Navigate all terms** box at the top of your full-text document. Then use the **Previous** or **Next** arrow next to the box to navigate. When you reach the last occurrence of a term in your full-text document, click the **Next** arrow and move to the **first occurrence in the succeeding document**. (Click the **Previous** arrow and move from the first occurrence in a document to the last occurrence in the preceding document.)

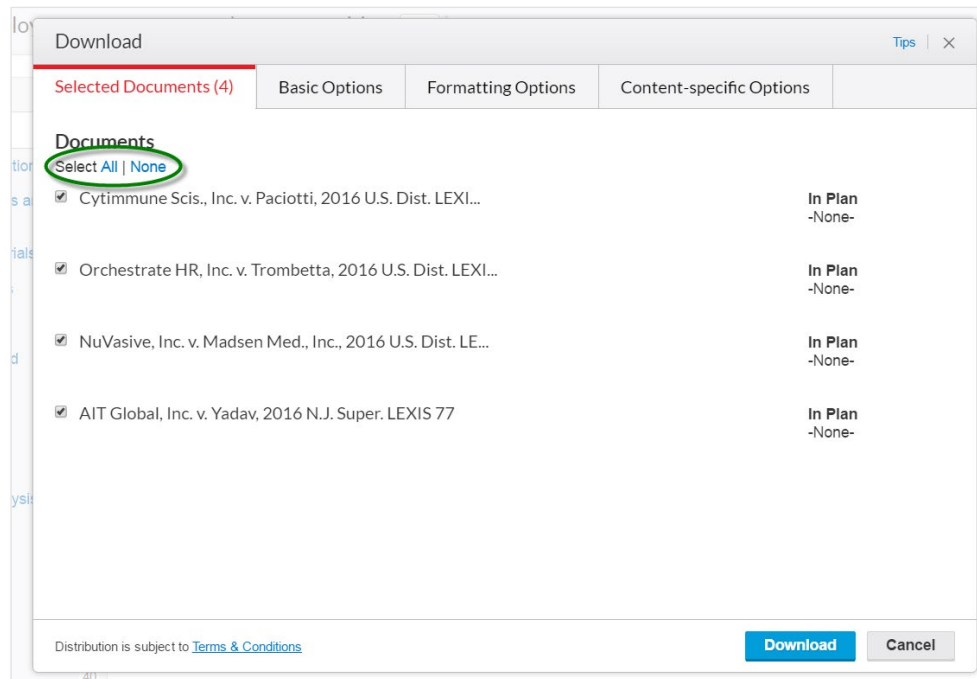

Select or clear documents for delivery en masse and speed up your delivery. Click **All** to deliver all documents in the delivery tray or **None** to clear delivery choices.

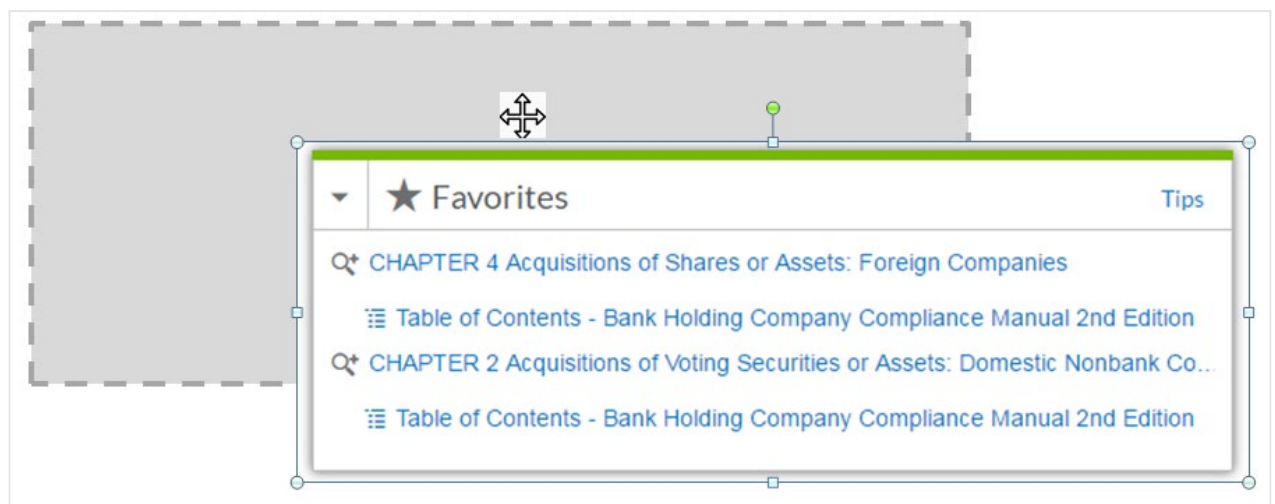
